VISION: WHY DO WE DO WHAT WE DO?

Revelation 7.9-17

WHAT IS VISION, AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Vision identifies a problem. Something that is that shouldn't be, or something that isn't that should be. Vision is the end goal, the main reason why we do what we do. Everyone has vision, we all have reasons and motivations for what we do. Having a clear vision for life and ministry radically shapes how and what you do with decisions and pursuits.

The goal of Life Mission Church shouldn't vary that much (if at all) from the big goal of the universal church. And the universal church shouldn't vary that much from the big goal of God, since we, the church, are His body, and His body must be in concert with Him, the Head. To best determine vision, look to the end goal. For us, we look to the end goal of God, which can be found, among other places, in **Revelation 7.9-17**.

The end goal of God is that He would gather for Himself a people from all nations, that He would be their God, be glorified among them and enjoyed by them, for all eternity.

1 Peter 2.9, 10 // Ephesians 3.7-10

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOU?

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK



Without cheating, what would you say the Vision ("Why we exist") of Life Mission Church is? How do you think we are doing with that Vision, and what specific ways are we pursuing it? What do you think about the Vision of the church? Is it biblical? Does it align with what it seems that God desires His church to pursue? Why or why not? For you as a believer, what should the purpose and goal of every believer be? Secondly, what is the typical purpose and goal of an average believer? How would you define your purpose and goal in life? In other words, how would you answer the question of "why do I do what I do?" Give the real and functional answer, whether it's the "biblically correct" answer or not. Read Ephesians 1.4-12, 2.10 and Psalm 67. What specific purposes do you see for yourself in here?

How do these verses get highlighted by some of the guotes in the Sermon Notes? Which of those quotes resonate with you the most and why?

Lastly, read Psalm 37.4, 5. Most often, our desires do not line up with God's. Our (functional) vision for life is not like the one we find in the Word that God desires for us. These verses show us how to get our vision lined up with God's. How do these verses point this out for us?
