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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before discussion begins, is there anyone who can recite the memory verse?

Read John 15:1-17. In our continued study of these verses, what was most impactful from the sermon and this passage in the context of prayer?

On Sunday, Jobey mentioned that prayer is not just simply coming to God with our hopes or just "pouring our heart out" before the Lord (though our prayers may have that in them). In John 15:7 Jesus says to "ask whatever we wish, and it will be done for you." Though it seems like prayer is in fact "asking whatever we wish," what important stipulation does Jesus put on prayer before we "ask whatever we wish" for it to be the kind of prayer that God desires for us?

Read John 14:6. Dietrich Bonhoeffer says "Prayer is finding the way to God and speaking with Him, whether your heart is empty or full. No one can do that by himself. We need Jesus Christ to do that." When we consider the truth that we are not just simply praying to God but are also praying with Him and through Him by the Son, Jesus Christ, how does this change the way in which we think about prayer and respond to God in prayer?

Read Romans 8:31-34. According to these verses, God has already graciously given us the greatest gift in His Son, who has interceded on our behalf by his death and resurrection. And now the Son continues His intercession on our behalf in the very presence of the Father at His right hand. If God is for us, what still hinders us from drawing near to His throne of grace with confidence and responding to the sacrifice of His own Son? How does the truth of Christ's progressive intercession on our behalf enable us to boldly pursue communion with God in prayer?

Now read Colossians 3:1-3. What should be our response to God since our old self was crucified with Christ and we have been raised to new life with Him in His resurrection? Because our prayer is coming from a place of His merit and His righteousness rather than our own, what does abiding in Christ and seeking the things that are above look like in our daily lives and how we pray?

Read the J.I. Packer quote in the sermon notes, then read John 15:7 again and Jeremiah 29:12, 13. How does approaching God in prayer starting first with His Word, His promises, and a heart for Him radically change the dynamic of prayer? How does Jesus say that God will respond to this kind of prayer in John 15:7-11?

Pray together as a group. Give thanks and praise to God for the intercession and greatest gift of His Son, Jesus Christ. Ask God to reveal Himself as you continually respond to Him in prayer.
