# LEARNING TO PRAY THE PSALMS

Luke 11.1-4 // Psalm 1

# THE LORD'S PRAYER AND THE PSALMS

If we want to learn to truly pray in the Spirit, in Jesus' Name, we must learn to pray by the themes and focuses that He gives to us. When the disciples say, "Lord, teach us to pray," He gives them a model. But this model isn't necessarily new.

Where most books of the bible focus primarily on writing to us *about God*, the Psalms are primarily written to God. It is prayer book, largely meant to be prayer that we sing.

Both the Psalms and the Lord's Prayer are unique in that they are prayers not only spoken to God, but also prayers spoken by God. Jesus spoke the Lord's Prayer, and God the Spirit spoke the Psalms.

The Psalms are not prayers that seek after God, but prayers that respond to a God who seeks after us.

## A MEDITATION ON MEDITATION

Psalm 1.1-6

Psalm 1 and 2 mainly, however, serve not as prayers, per se, but *introductions* to this book of prayers. They give the reader a *reason* why we should pray these Psalms. They are meditations on the importance of meditation! Significantly, the first word in Psalm 1 is "blessed." The psalmist wants the reader to know, "if you learn to meditate on the following 149 psalms, you will be blessed."

# God's Law is a javelin, and your heart is the target.

When we pray the Psalms, we are praying from our own hearts, yes. But we also join with David in his prayers. But we don't stop there; these psalms were meant to be sung by Israel, so we also join with them. But even more, nearly the entire history of the church has sung these and learned these as prayers, so we join with them. But most significantly, when we pray the Psalms, we are praying with God Himself, because these are prayers spoken by Him *through* David and the other psalmists.

# **NEXT STEPS**

The psalms penetrate the Lord's Prayer and the Lord's Prayer penetrates the Psalms. So it is possible to understand one on the basis of the other and bring them into joyful harmony.

The Lord's Prayer is expanded in the Psalms, and the Psalms are made more clear and fully understood by the Lord's Prayer. It's as if Jesus gives them the Cliffnotes version of the Psalms, letting them know the main themes of effective prayer.

In the coming weeks, we'll be asking the Lord to teach us to pray these themes, looking at them more intently, and learning how to really pray and commune with our God.

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# COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK


Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

- 1. Read Luke 11:1-4 and Psalm 1. What stuck out to you from these set of verses or what did you take out of the sermon on Sunday?
- 2. Read James 4:8, Psalm 9:1-2, 1 John 1:9, and Ephesians 6:16-18. Why is prayer important? Why is praying through the Psalms valuable?
- 3. Jobey said on Sunday that prayer is not something that is natural to us, but is something that is learned. How do we learn how to pray?
- 4. Read 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-18 and Matthew 6: 5-13. What does your time in prayer look like? What time of day? Where do you pray? How long are your prayers? Are you focused, distracted, consistent, or sporadic? What do you pray about? Do you have an internal template? Be honest with where you're at. If you're prayer life is strong, this is a good opportunity for you to encourage others. Where do you want to grow the most in your prayer life?
- 5. As a church, we'll be offering some ways to deepen, strengthen, and build our prayer lives. We will have a schedule for a Morning and Evening Psalm (viewable via the PrayerMate app (go to our website for directions on how to use it), through our Facebook postings, and we will soon have a schedule on our website. We also are recommending a few books on prayer, and of course we have our Weekly Memory Verse. What ways, whether these or others, will you be committing to in order to increase your prayer life and "learn" to pray? Have you decided to do this with anyone, such as a spouse, your kids, friends, or people in your Community Group?
- 6. As we began the year, Community Groups were asked to gather a list of people or things to be praying about throughout the year. How is this going? If you haven't already established how you're going to be praying for these people/things, revisit the list and discuss what the path forward looks like for you personally and as a group.

Spend time as a group praying in the P.R.A.Y. model, which is modeled after the Lord's Prayer. Try incorporating the themes from Psalm 1, "marrying" those themes with the elements of the Lord's Prayer.
