FAITH THAT DIVIDES RELATIONSHIPS

Matthew 10.21-25, 34-39

EXPECTING DIVISION

Matthew 10.21-25 // 1 Peter 2.21, 4.12-14 // 1 John 3.13

Division means "two visions." Don't be surprised to see that the world view of the bible is radically different than the world view of the world, and so when the two collide, division will be very real. The world is fine with Christians if our world view matches theirs – be good to others, serve, love each other, etc. – but if we insist that it is more than that, we should expect to be persecuted, because Christ was persecuted.

FAMILIES DIVIDED

Matthew 10.34-39

Are you willing to follow Jesus on His terms?

We cannot attempt to soften Jesus' words. It's just not possible, but yet we do this in order to justify our own lives. But the reality is that **we must be more concerned with others' relationship with their God rather than their relationship with us.**

THE SOLUTION: TAKE UP YOUR CROSS

Matthew 10.38, 39

It must have sounded so strange and appalling for the disciples to hear Jesus say, "take up your cross." The cross was not yet associated with His sacrificial death. There was no sentimental attachment, and no glory of a Savior's death. In their eyes, a cross had no redeemable value. He's letting them know that they must be willing to lose all, even their reputation and image, laying everything aside for the sake of the Gospel.

We Must See Ourselves as Walking Dead Men

- We are dead to self-centeredness
- We are dead to self-preservation
- We are dead to self-infatuation
- We are dead to self-promotion

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Matthew 10:21-33. What stuck out to you in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

Last week, when we gathered both on Sunday for corporate worship and in our **Community Groups**, many of us studied, talked and prayed about how we would share the Gospel with others. It seemed that fear is one of the main reasons that we don't share our faith. On Sunday, we looked further into this idea of being persecuted for answering the call of follow Jesus. In **Matthew 10:23** Jesus says "*when* they persecute you", not "*if* they persecute you." We know that in this life, if we are obedient that we will be persecuted at times for our faith. Explain how are you currently being persecuted or experiencing suffering for the sake of the Gospel. If you are not experiencing suffering or persecution, could it be because you have been fearful or disobedient in answering the call to "proclaim the Gospel from the rooftops" or "acknowledging Him before men?"

Read **1 Peter 4:17.** What do we have to lose if we don't answer Jesus' call to share the Gospel? What is at stake if we don't "Go"?

Read Romans 5:3-5, Matthew 5:11, 1 Peter 4:12-16, 1 Peter 5:10, 2 Corinthians 4:17. What is encouraging for us to remember when we are obedient in "suffering for the sake of the Gospel?"


Author and Pastor John Bunyan said "It is not what enemies will, nor what they are resolved upon, but what God will, and what God appoints, that shall be done...And as no enemy can bring suffering upon a man when the will of God is otherwise, so no man can save himself out of their hands when God will deliver him up for his glory...God has appointed who shall suffer. Suffering comes not by chance or by the will of man, but by the will and appointment of God." Write down your thoughts about this quote and share with the group. Does your "flesh" battle any part of this quote? Write your thoughts down in your personal study, then share with the group.

Recently, in our church's 2 year bible reading plan we read about the story of Joseph. If you remember, Joseph was sold into slavery by his jealous brothers experiencing suffering as a slave and as a prisoner. Read **Genesis 45:1-15**. Who did Joseph give credit to for being sold into slavery? What was his perspective on it? Other way to think of it, who does Joseph thank for his suffering? What can you learn from his outlook on this circumstance?

Read Revelation 5:1-12. Remind yourself that both in Heaven and on earth Jesus, the "Lamb that was slain" is worshiped because He suffered, because He was slain. Then pray both in your personal time of "abiding" and together in Community with this verse in mind. When you pray, Preach this passage into your heart and into your mind! Next, confess and Repent of the sin of so often fearing man. Next, re-read Matthew 10:26-28. Ask God to give you a heart that does not fear man, but God. Pray for faith that "might not rest in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God." (1 Corinthians 2:5) Last, end with Thanksgiving and Yield to His will.
