AN UNLIKELY MESSIAH

Matthew 11.1-15

John is the last of the Old Testament prophets, even though his story is in the New Testament, he prophesied *before* the actual New Covenant was initiated, which was at the cross of Christ. John, like most Jews, was expecting something a little different when picturing the coming Messiah. He sends his disciples to ask Jesus if He really is the One.

Matthew 11.16-24

Oftentimes, we think that "if God were just do this or that," or "if He were to just make Himself known" in some irrefutable way, we would repent. But this is foolish thinking. Adam and Eve had a perfect paradise and sinned; the Hebrews saw the parting of the Red Sea and still rebelled; Jesus performed many miracles in towns that denied Him. We are far too optimistic about the condition of the human heart, and all of this continual rejection serves to show us how deep our need for God's saving grace really is.

THE ONLY SOLUTION

What then, is the cause for those that are saved? What is the only hope for the human soul? Outside of the merciful and *initiating* love and grace of God, there is no hope for us, because we are dead in our sins. This is the wage we have earned (**Romans 6.23**).

1 John 4.19 // John 15.16

Regeneration: because we dead, we need to be "regenerated." This word is synonymous with the phrase "born again," and denotes not simply a change of behavior, but an actual rebirth on the inside; a re-creation, as J.I. Packer puts it.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR EVANGELISM?

How Then, Should We Approach Evangelism?

- Understand what You are up Against: We are not battling flesh and blood (people). We are battling a kingdom of darkness that has blinded the eyes of people.
- Believing in God's Power to Save: This should cause us to put all of our hope not in physical weapons or tactics, but solely on spiritual ones. Namely, the Gospel, prayer, and our witness (lifestyle and fruit). Clearly, the three primary "means of grace" for the believer are also the three primary "means of grace" for the unregenerate.
- Relentless Sharing of the Gospel: 1 Peter 1.23 tells us that it is the "Word of God" that causes people to be "born again."
- **Prayer:** Since people are "born, not...of the will of man, but of God," we therefore pray earnestly and without ceasing.
- Never Giving Up: We also recognize that we are the ministers of reconciliation, sent to preach, pray, and be witnesses, never giving up, believing that God's grace can and will strive with man, as He did with us.

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Matthew 11:1-24. What stuck out to you in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?_____

Since this week you will be going to our quarterly GPS (Gospel Positioning Strategy) Meeting in lieu of your Community Group, let's focus the rest of our attention this week on the Two Year Bible Reading Plan. At this point, we are roughly 10 weeks into the reading plan. What has been your favorite part of Genesis, Exodus and Psalms so far? How has the Two Year Bible Reading Plan helped you abide in the vine? Or if you haven't been doing the plan, what has been your favorite part in your recent reading, and how has it helped you stay rooted in the Gospel? How has being in the Good News compare now rather than before you started the plan? If you aren't doing the plan, what is your plan to be abiding in the Word every day?

On Sunday, Jobey talked about how God hardened Pharaoh's heart. He also talked about how as soon as God delivered the Israelites out of Egypt (Exodus 15:22-17:7) only days later they complained showing very grateful hearts. Which one best describes you; a hardened heart or an ungrateful heart towards God? If you struggle with one or both, how can you repent by "putting off the old self and putting on the new self" (Ephesians 4:22-24)? In other words, how can you line up your heart with God's will?

At the **Covenant Membership** class, Jobey passed out the "**Discipleship Plan**". If you haven't done so already, fill it out and reflect on your answers. If you haven't yet, or if you didn't attend the class, ask yourself the general question "What's my plan for growth in the Gospel?"

What are some of the names and characteristics of God that have stuck out to you in **Psalms**? List them out.

Read Exodus 15 and **Ephesians 1:7**. You are redeemed by the blood of Christ. What can wash away my sin? Nothing but the blood of Jesus. God didn't just redeem His people from slavery but through the blood of Jesus purchased your freedom from the slavery of sin! Spend quiet time praying, reflecting and praising Him for your redemption and proclaiming this truth to yourself that you are free!
