Matthew 26.1-3

THE PLOT TO KILL JESUS

The Jewish leaders, after being put in their place by Jesus, now plot to kill Him. But not during the Passover, as there will be so many out of town visitors, many would be supporters.

Jesus told His disciples that this would be happening. This was about six days before His crucifixion.

THE ANOINTING OF JESUS

Matthew 26.6-13 // John 12.1-8

Bethany is a village about two miles east of Jerusalem. Jesus would stay here often, and here he is at a man named Simon's house. Sisters and brother, Mary, Martha, and Lazarus (whom Jesus had just raised from the dead) also live in Bethany, and are present at this meal. Mary pours out 300 denarii worth of perfume on Jesus. Judas confronts her, but Jesus rebukes him.

Concentration and Diffusion

C.H. Spurgeon describes this scene using the words "concentration" and "diffusion." Mary was 100% concentrated on Jesus, with no regard of what Judas or others would think. Additionally, her worship *itself* was concentrated, meaning not watered down.

The result of this kind of worship? It was diffused throughout the whole house. But the order is important. Too often, we try to go and fix, help, and change, without ourselves first being enamored and in love with Christ, filled with His power.

CENTER, NOT FIRST

True worship will result in the spreading of the aroma of Christ.

Jesus makes the point that we will always have the poor, as well as other needs, but we need to make Him the center. He does *not* mean to neglect the poor, but rather to make sure our priority is set. We should not have Him as *first* on our list of things to do, but the *center* of *all that we do*.

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read through Matthew 26:1-13. What stood out to you the most from these verses or the message on Sunday?_

Focusing on the context of Christ's statement in Matthew 26:2, skim through the previous two chapters. Why do you think Christ wanted to end his discourse with his disciples with the prediction of his crucifixion? What is he trying to tell them? Read Matthew 16:24.

In Matthew 26:2-5, Christ predicts his crucifixion in the contexts of Passover. Read Exodus 12:3-14, 1 Corinthians 5:7-8 and Revelation 5:6-14. What is the importance of the Passover in connection with Christ's crucifixion? Who were the "chief priests and the elders" who were discussing killing Jesus and why is their position ironic in the contexts of this Scripture.

Read verses 6-9. Was your first thought in reading the disciples' comments to agree (or maybe just sympathize a little bit) with their reaction? Didn't Jesus just tell them in Matthew 25:35-40 that we should help care for the poor? How do you reconcile what Jesus is telling us in these two passages?

Do you ever catch yourself focusing on the act of worship rather than the object of worship? Read Luke 10:38-42. What was Mary's heart in that passage?

Why do you think the disciples reacted the way they did? Do you think the disciples, who spent much of their time with Christ, began to take for granted their communion with Jesus? (For a comparison, read John 1:29 and 49).

Thinking about your acts of worship, is your goal to do enough to feel pretty good about it? Do you give, serve, pray, read Scripture, and go to church to "check it off" for the week? Or are you earnestly pressing in to fall deeper in love with your Lord? Is your worship concentrated, both in its focus as well as in its totality? Or is watered down, or divided with other objects? Read through Psalm 145:1-7.

We are commanded to be generous and hospitable, to worship and meet regularly with believers, to pray, and to be in God's Word. But none of those things are the goal. This is why the start of our P.R.A.Y. model is "Preach." Spend some time in prayer this week, preaching to yourself, reminding yourself of the object of your acts of worship, focusing on God himself, reading some Psalms, and repenting of viewing your acts of service or outward obedience as "good enough" to get by. Be prepared to discuss in your community groups how you've been challenged in your times of prayer.
