## COMMUNITY CROUD HOMEWORK

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK
Read <b>Genesis 10.32-11.9</b> . What stuck out to you the most or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday or from these verses?
What was it that he inhabitants of Babel were hoping to accomplish?
Read <b>Genesis 1.28, 9.1,</b> and <b>10.32.</b> Then read <b>11.4,</b> followed by <b>verse 8 and 9.</b> What was God's command, the people's response, and then God's reaction to their response?
Read <b>Deuteronomy 30.5</b> and <b>Genesis 12.2.</b> Is God opposed to humans doing well? If you say 'no' based on these verses, then why would God want to stop what was going on in Babel?
Read <b>Proverbs 16.25</b> and <b>Isaiah 55.8, 9.</b> How would these verses show the contrast between the things we pursue on our own and the things that God wants for us?
Like those dwelling in Babel, we often want to do things "our way," even if they are contrary to what God's design is. Read <b>Isaiah 5.20, 21.</b> In what ways in your own life do you think you are "doing things your way" and even ignoring God's design and desires?
What makes you want to do things "your way," and what is the solution to getting that to change?
John Owens, a 17th Century pastor, said "only the Gospel can get the root [of sin] out." At the end of the day, our hearts need to be changed, and we don't have the power to do that. Burying the Gospel promises and truth of God in our hearts is the only thing that will enable and empower us to change. Oh Sunday, Jobey said that "self-sufficiency is the enemy of God-dependency." What promises and truths of God can help you "let go" of some of your own "self-sufficiency" in order to really trust God, particularly in the areas of your life that you have said you are doing things "your way"?
Lastly, read Matthew 28.18-20, Romans 10.13-18, Mark 13.26, 27, and Revelation 18.1-10. What is God's ultimate purpose and reason for us to "be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth"?
