COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Romans 1:1-16 and Romans 10:11-17. What stuck out to you in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

Read Matthew 28:18-20. What is the first word in verse 19? Is this a request from Jesus, a suggestion or a commission? Which one do you treat it as?

At our church, one of the biggest vehicles that we have in making disciples and seeing God's glory be made known to all the nations is through our Community Groups. How can your group together be a part of making strong disciples that are focused on God's glory among the nations?

Read Romans 3:23. What does it tell us? Who falls short of God's glory? Just Americans or "all" people? Now read Romans 6:23. If a person isn't saved, what's the punishment for their sin? Is this bad news reality for you? How can you help bring the message of reconciliation (2 Corinthians 5:18-21) to all nations?

Read 2 Corinthians 12:7-10. Since most of us feel weak, unequipped, unworthy and have a "thorn in our flesh," what is the good news about "feeling" these things?

Read John 20:19-21. What is happening in these verses? What are the disciples afraid of? What are Jesus' words? Who is with us as we "Go?"

Read 2 Corinthians 4:7. Some of us don't know where to start in the "making disciples" auest so we stand idle. We watch as others that we "feel" are more equipped than us move and "Go." Our insecurities and fears keep us quiet when we should speak; we often want comfort when we are commissioned to be "sent." What needs to take place or happen in your heart, mind and soul for you to move? What will empower you to do this task that seems impossible? What will give you strength?

In the sermon notes there is a quote from John Piper that says, "Go, send or disobey." In the past, maybe you have been sitting "in the stands" and not "playing in the game". If so, why? What are you waiting for? The "Great Coach" has already called all of His players to play in the game! What are some steps you can take to participate in glorifying the Name above all names to all nations!? By going, or by helping send someone? Fill in the blank. If happens, then I'll "Go". Fill in the blank. If happens, then I'll "help send someone."

End the group with prayer using the P.R.A.Y. model. Start by reading the Gospel (Romans 3:23-24), then spend time confessing and repenting of sin, then ask God to empower you to be "sent." End with thanksgiving to God, who saved you from hell and has brought you into a safe, never-ending, always and forever covenant relationship that nothing can destroy. (Romans 8:39)
