YOUR WILL BE DONE Matthew 26.36-68

WILLING SPIRIT, WEAK FLESH

Peter, James, and John were specifically brought with Jesus to help Him keep watch. Even after big claims by Peter, and even with their love and devotion to Jesus, they give in to the temptation of sleep. Jesus responds to their actions by giving them a clear diagnosis: "the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."

LET THIS CUP PASS FROM ME

Jesus knew that all of this would happen. Every rebellious, God-denying decision we would each make. And yet He went forward with the definite plan of His Father. He took the cup given to Him by His Father.

The Cup: This is the cup of God's wrath, filled with His fury, anger, and hatred towards sin, evil, and death. It is a cup that every human should drink, but one that He drank for us. **Isaigh 51.17. Jeremigh 25.15. Psalm 11.6. Ezekiel 23.32**

Let it Pass: Jesus, being fully human, experiences the same type of desire for avoidance of painful and hurtful circumstances as we do.

Not as I Will: However, He does not want to avoid pain at the cost of insisting on His way if His desires don't line up with the Father's.

But Your Will be Done: He submits and yields to the definite plan of His Father. He trusts in His Father and is deeply committed to purchasing us for salvation.

- **Propitiation:** sin needs full and holy punishment, and it needs to be in full in order to satisfy God's holy anger and hatred towards sin and death.
- **Substitutionary Atonement:** there is a penalty for sin, and an actual substitution was made; this Substitute was equal (human) but able (divine).

The dying Jesus is the evidence of God's anger toward sin; but the living Jesus is the proof of God's love and forgiveness.

OUR ENCOURAGEMENT

Despite knowing everyone would abandon Him and turn their backs on Him, and knowing that He would have a false trial and drink the wrath of His Father, Jesus was able to still, as a human, say, "not My will, but Your will" to His Father.

But there are two hopes we are given here from His actions and resolve:

- 1. Hope that can prevent us from falling under pressure.
- 2. Hope that reminds us that even when we fail, He did not, and He will not.

Christus Exemplar: Christ is our example when we face suffering and trials. **Christus Victor:** He is also our victor, especially for when we fail.

Part of what makes suffering so hard for us, is that we have not yet really learned to pray and trust in these words, "let Your will be done, and not mine." However, Christ gives us hope that can prevent us from failing under pressure, because He Himself is our example.

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read through Matthew 26:30-68. What stood out to you the most from these verses or the message on Sunday?

Review verse 38 specifically. Why do you think Jesus said His soul was "Very sorrowful, even to death"? Do you think it was because He was to be crucified or something else? See Isaiah 53:3-6, 2 Corinthians 5:21, and Psalm 22:1, 14-18.

Jesus tells us in John 10:31 that He and the Father are one. Does Christ's prayer in Matthew 26:39, 42 reveal a rift between Him and the Father? How do we reconcile what we know about the Trinity with Christ's prayers in verses 39 and 42?

What is your first thought when you hear the "submission"? Generally negative or positive? What can we learn from Christ's prayers to His Father? Read Ephesians 5:25-27, Hebrews 5:7-10, and Matthew 26:53-54.

What was the "cup" that Christ was referring to? Read Matthew 20:22, Jeremiah 25:15, Isaiah 51:17, Psalm 75:8, Revelation 14:10. How are we as believers to understand God's "cup of wrath"? What is it and why is it necessary?

How do you think Jesus felt when He found the disciples sleeping on several occasions while He was praying? Do you ever feel like your own shortcomings may get in the way of serving Christ? Read 2 Corinthians 1:27-29, 12:10, and Romans 8:26. Is it our own efforts or talents that advance the Kingdom, or something else?

This passage paints an incredible portrait of Christ's humanity, as well as His deity. We see Christ in anguish over what He is facing and yet completely submitted to His Father, betrayed and let down by His closest friends, arrested and accused of blasphemy, and yet we see Christ maintain His complete authority. (See, John 1:1-5 and 10-14; and Colossians 1:15-17.) Using the P.R.A.Y. model, spend some time dwelling on what Christ came to accomplish. Think about what it means that He clothed Himself in humanity for our sake, and what it means that we get to be clothed by His righteousness. Be prepared to share in your Community Groups what this knowledge means for your daily walk.
