Matthew 26.69-27.10

JUDAS

At the heart of this most-famous part of the Gospel Story, the Main Character, "Faithful and True" is bound. But He remains faithful, even though He is betrayed and denied by His closest friends.

Yes, Judas....

- Grieved over the terrible thing he had done.
- Confessed his sin and gave back the money.
- Turned from his sin, but not to God.

Instead of trusting that God will forgive, he turned to despair.

- He had a godless regret, but either believed....
 - 1. He's beyond forgiveness
 - 2. Or that he had to atone for his own sin in order to please God.

Matthew 27.1-5

PETER

Yes, Peter sinned royally, but....

- Jesus told him that he would betray Him. Peter said "Lord! I would never!"
- Peter "remembered the words of Jesus." (Verse 75)
- Jesus looked at Peter. (Luke 22:61)
- He was melted unto tears of godly sorrow!

And then, by the grace of God, Peter is reinstated.

"Learn this lesson: not to trust Christ because you repent,
but trust Christ to make you repent; not to come to Christ because you have
a broken heart, but to come to Him that He may give you a broken heart; not
to come to Him because you are fit to come, but to come to Him because
you are unfit to come. Your fitness is your unfitness.

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Matthew 26:69-27:10. What stuck out to you from these verses or was most impactful from the message on Sunday?

Read 2 Corinthians 7:10. What is the difference between Judas' response to his sin and Peter's? Where did their responses ultimately lead them?

Are there still things in your life that you have done that keep you living in regret? In those regrets do you identify more with Judas' worldly regret or Peter's godly repentance?

How do you rebound after you sin? What is your typical response?


Read 2 Timothy 2:13, Ephesians 6:16-18, and James 5:16. How can we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus NOW so that when we do sin and have regret that we can turn to a repentance like Peter's rather than a despair like Judas'?

What are some Scriptures you can turn to in times of regret and despair? Take some time to search out some good Gospel truths you can share to encourage one another. Consider choosing one to memorize as a group.

As a group, spend time in prayer utilizing the P.R.A.Y. model. Read through Romans 5:6-11. PRAISE God for sending His son Jesus, who by His blood, has set us free from the burden of regret and guilt; but more importantly, the wrath of God. REPENT of your unfaithfulness and areas of sin. ASK for a response to your sin that resembles that of Peter and not Judas. Finally, humbly YIELD to the will of our sovereign God.
