WHAT IS SUBMISSION? : VERSES 1 AND 2

Genesis 3.16, 4.7, 8 // Ephesians 5.21-33 // Colossians 3.18-25 // 1 Timothy 3.11

Likewise: This word is important, because it points to the previous examples of submission and humble service. Submission is not just a marriage issue. It's a worship issue.

Submission is not inferiority; it is Godlike.

Wives' own husbands: It's important to note that this is not calling women to subject to ALL men, but specifically wives to their *own* husbands.

Submission is NOT:

- Agreeing with husband 100%
- Not having your own opinion or uniqueness
- Avoiding all efforts to see change in husband
- Putting husband's will above God's will
- Does not mean getting all your spiritual strength from your husband
- Does not mean living out of fear or in total silence; it is not degrading

Submission IS:

- A reflection of the Trinity; it is Christ-like
- God's design for us as complementary equals in His image
- A desire to lovingly follow as a partner
- Delighting in seeing your husband succeed in godly leadership
- Delighting in seeing your gifts be used to build a marriage God's way
- A result of many fruits of the Spirit: humility, patience, selflessness, joy, peace, etc.

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

What stuck out to you the most or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?
Read 1 Peter 3.1-6. What words or thoughts through these first few verses jump out at you?
What words come to mind when you hear the word "submission"?
What words do you think <i>should</i> come to mind?
Why is it so hard for us to like the idea of submission? What is the solution to be able to embrace it and enjoy it?
Read Genesis 3.16. How would you interpret this text?
Now read Genesis 4.7. The same words "desire" and "rule" are used in 3.16 and 4.7. Knowing that, how does the context of 4.7 help interpret the context of 3.16?
Knowing 4.7 shows us that woman's "desire" is not a romantic, loving desire, because we know that sin's desire for us is not romantic, but dominating. This is why we know studying in context objectively is so important. When we admit and recognize that our motives are often faulty and self-seeking, we take a step toward real freedom and strength.
At this point, it would be best to break into men and women's groups. For the married women, when is it the hardest for you to be submitted and be led by your husband? For the single and married men and single women, in what area of life is it most difficult to be led and be humble, like the example given in 1 Peter 2.13-25? Be very careful to not gossip during this time of ministry and prayer.

Identifying your idols often leads to identifying where you have major holdouts when it comes to submitting to Christ. How do your findings help you identify what areas you have trouble with when it comes to submission?
Paul specifically mentions outward appearance as a common idol that women in particular find "life" in. For men and women, what ways do you struggle with finding identity in the outward? What would a good strategy be to combat that?
