1 Thessalonians 2.7-20

THE DIFFICULTY OF FRIENDSHIPS

1 Thessalonians 2.7-12

Paul gives us a powerful picture of his love and heart for the Thessalonian people. But obviously his friendship with them didn't start this way. What are some things that hinder us from building and cultivating this kind of love and devotion towards one another?

Time and Priority: With work, marriage, and kids, we tend to quickly let our lives revolve around these things. Though very good things, we must not neglect the other important ways God has designed our live to find health and joy.

Fear and Unwillingness to be Known: "Vulnerable," "intimate," and "transparent" are words that scare many people. Men and women both can fear these things, but for different reasons. Insecurity and pride will rob us of many great life-altering things, including having deep, joy-filled friendships.

Self-Centeredness: The bottom line is that we often make our lives about ourselves, rather than others. Even though the Great Commandment is to love God and love people, we tend to focus on our own selves more than anything.

Ecclesiastes 4.9-12 // Proverbs 12.25, 17.17

PRACTICAL WAYS TO PURSUE FRIENDSHIPS

But like Paul's picture of a nursing baby, our friendships must start small, and we must see them as worthwhile investments.

Beginning: C.S. Lewis says that a friendship begins when you "see" and value something in the same way someone else does. It could be as simple as sports or movies. But from that point, we have to work hard and make the effort and not give up quickly. As the Gospel softens our hearts and we fight discouragement, cynicism, criticism, and being judgmental, we become affectionate towards others, ready to give them our own lives, as Paul said.

This is true friendship when there is one heart in two bodies.

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

Read Ecclesiastes 4:9-12. What stood out to you the most from Sunday's sermon? Take a look at 2 Timothy 1:1-7. What is Paul doing for Timothy? How is he affecting Timothy's heart and ministry? Now jump to 2 Timothy 4:9-11. What is Paul seeking here? Read Proverbs 10:11,20,21,31,32; Proverbs 18:21 and Proverbs 27:6. How can your words be used in friendship? Have you ever thought about how important your words are to friends? Look at Colossians 3:12-17 and John 17:20-21. How are our friendships and relationships used for God's glory? Other than these verses, what else does God use friendships for? Look back through the sermon notes for clues. What are the things that prevent you from pursuing deeper and growing friendships? Time, priority, fear, discouragement...or something else? Paul even compared his friendship with the Thessalonians with a nursing baby. What can you do to combat those things in order to give you the determination to feed and nurture friendships rather than get discouraged and give up easy? Who are you actively pursuing as a growing and deepening friendship, and what do you think each friendship needs for deepened growth? Going deeper like having Fight Clubs? More laughter and fun? More challenging talks?
