Matthew 13.31-33, 44-46, 51, 52

SLOW BUT STEADY

Matthew 13.31-33

The Kingdom Defined: the Kingdom of God is not a realm (a place), but a rule. It is "seen" wherever Christ is King.

In the Parable of the Mustard Seed, Jesus lets the people know that the Kingdom will grow *outwardly* from a very small stature, invisible even, but will slowly grow to its full fruition, larger than anything else, and bringing comfort and peace to those who enjoy it. These Jews expected the Kingdom to come loudly and instantly, but this is not the case.

In the Parable of the Leaven, He also lets them know that *inwardly*, the Kingdom spreads throughout us slowly, *but* it will spread *thoroughly*, even if hard to see.

WORTH IT ALL

But how exactly does the Kingdom continue to spread in our lives? To be sure, this is a sovereign act of God, but it also has a means, not just a sure end. So what is the vehicle that takes you to God's predetermined, promised future?

It is His glory.

We follow Jesus not by learning to obey a bunch of rules and trying hard to be a better person; we follow Jesus as we see His infinite beauty and worth so much that we *gladly* give up anything and everything to follow Him.

Ephesians 3.14-21// Matthew 13.44-46, 51, 52

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Matthew 13:31-33, 44-46, and 51-52. What stuck out to you the most or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday or from these verses?

In Matt 13:31-32, what is Jesus conveying to the people of Israel and how does that relate to our own sanctification?

In Matthew 13:33, Jesus turns inward toward the heart just as the leaven is at work in the flour. What is at work in our heart? Read Ezekiel 36:26-27.

On Sunday, Jobey mentioned a number of sins that Christians around the world struggle with on a daily basis. Which one of the sin issues can you relate to? Any others come to mind? Where is the Holy Spirit at work in your heart and what is He revealing? In light of your sin, read Romans 3:23-26, Romans 5:8-9, Romans 6:4, and 1 John 1:8-9.

In Matt 13:44-46, Jesus compares heaven to buried treasure and fine pearls. In both parables, the man sells all that he has to secure his treasure. Is there any "treasure" in your life that you value more than your relationship with Christ and your salvation?

Assess your heart. Do you find Jesus beautiful in this season of your life? Is He worth abandoning every last thing you own or value? If so, talk about what is at work in your heart. If not, confess this to your group and find someone in your group to Fight Club with this week.

Using the P.R.A.Y. model, spend time as a group praising God for sending His Son, Jesus, who makes our salvation possible through His life and death. Praise God for sending the Holy Spirit who is relentless and actively at work in transforming our hearts. Repent of a flesh that is always placing obstacles to Christ. Ask God that we see Him in all His beauty that we may be reminded that the treasures of this world are nothing to be compared with what awaits us when we find comfort and rest in the home prepared for us in Heaven.
