A CHURCH BUILT BY SLAVES

Acts 16.6-40 // Philippians 1.1

BACKGROUND: A CHURCH IS BORN

Philippians 1.1

Philippians is a letter written by the Apostle Paul around 61 A.D. But the story doesn't start here, it starts back in Acts 16.6-40, the story of how the church in Philippi was born. This takes place around 51 A.D., the story of a missionary trip with Paul, Silas, Luke, and Timothy.

Acts 16.6-40

Here, you have these four men in an important city, and they meet a rich Asian woman, a poor, demon-possessed slave girl, and blue collar Roman prison guard, the Philippian church is born.

HOW GOD PLANTS AND GROWS CHURCHES

Significantly, the word "servants" in English is actually the word "slaves" in Greek. Yet it describes believers in the Old Testament 250 times, and 40 times in the New Testament.

Churches are started by, led by, and are built by slaves.

In a real sense, believers have no rights to their lives. We can't spend money how we desire, fill our calendar how we desire, or live wherever or however we choose. We've been bought with a price. 1 Corinthians 6.19, 20, 7.22-24

Slavery to Jesus means the freedom of joy, because slavery to Him brings freedom from the slavery of sin.

Romans 6.15-23

HOPE FOR THE SLAVE

It is a scary thought for many to be a slave. But there is hope for us. Philippians tells us that the Lord will complete the work He began in us, that we can do all things through Jesus because He is our strength, and that we need not be anxious for anything. If we fear the thought of being a slave for Jesus, we can rest in the fact that if God has truly begun a work in us, we need not have fear that He will work powerfully within us.

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who is able to recite the memory verse?

What stuck out to you the most or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

On Sunday, Jobey spoke about being a slave to Christ. He mentioned that believers don't really have any rights before God. How does the idea of being a "slave" sit with you? Do you submit faithfully? Or do you seek control of your own life? In which ways have you submitted yourselves faithfully, and in which ways to do you still seek to control your own life and do things your way as your own master?

Why can we be joyfully enslaved to Christ? What is the motivation?

What are some characteristics of God that make our submission "easy"?

Read Matthew 6:24. This verse specifically references money, but does this verse convict you in any other way? Is there another "god" you are serving? Finish the last sentence of **verse 24** for yourself: You cannot serve God and

Read Acts 16:6-12. Paul wanted to go to Asia, but as we read, they "were forbidden by the Holy Spirit to speak the word in Asia." So God, in all His sovereignty, closed that door. How would you characterize Paul's response to God closing that door?

Continue reading in Acts 16:13-40. What did God do through Paul after closing that door in Asia?

How do you deal with closed doors in your life? Do you turn in anger? Frustration? Does it push you away from God? Does it draw you closer to God? Explain.

Read Philippians 1:6. How might this verse encourage you when God closes a door in your life? In other words, what does this verse promise? Share how God has closed a door and redirected you for His glory and your ultimate joy.
