## PARTNERSHIP IN THE GOSPEL

Philippians 1.1-8

### **BACKGROUND: A CHURCH IS BORN**

Philippians 1.1-11

It's been 10 years, and the small group of people who had gotten saved have now become a church led by Elders, with Deacons administering, and faithful saints living sacrificially. The opening tone sets the stage for the whole letter and gives great insight into Paul's paternal care and love for the Philippians.

The word "partnership" that Paul uses is the Greek word "koinonia." It's the word we use for "fellowship," and is used to denote a unity that people have, whether in family, friendships, or even business.

### HOW DO WE PARTNER?

2 Corinthians 7.2-4

#### 1. Gospel Generosity and Sacrifice

- Much evidence points to the idea that the Philippian church was probably the most generous and financially supportive of Paul.
- The Word gives specific responsibility to the people to take care of those who labor for the Gospel.

## 2. Suffering with One Another

- Bearing with one another's burdens.
- We won't be perfect, and we'll always be able to do better/more.
- But we must be willing to suffer with each other.

### 3. Praying for and with One Another

- We must be actively praying for others, and praying with them.
- Being willing to go deeper in conversations.

## HOPE FOR OUR JOY

God has provided everything we need to pursue joy, unity, and partnership with others. He has already given you people to pray with, a church to grow in and be committed to, ministry and people to support with generosity, and He will continue and finish the job He began in you.

Our job is to recognize these things and step out, trusting that His Word is true. Then, putting the Gospel first in these things, we seek to be a blessing for the purpose of God's glory in the world we've been put in.

## COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who is able to recite the memory verse?

Read through Philippians 1:1-8. What stood out to you the most from these verses or the message on Sunday? \_

What two terms does Paul tend to use in his salutations? Read Romans 1:7, 1 Corinthians 1:3, 2 Corinthians 1:2, Galatians 1:3, Ephesians 1:2. Why do you think he chose these two terms for his greetings? Does focusing on one lead to the other?

Where is Paul when he's writing to the Philippians? (Hint: see verses 7 and 14.) In verses 3-5, Paul fondly remembers his time with the church at Philippi. Knowing what we learned last week about how Paul's first trip to Philippi went, and where Paul is when he's writing, does it surprise you that he is so joyful? In your own words, why do you think Paul is joyful? What is his focus?

We sometimes hear about Christians who don't feel the need to surround themselves with other believers, or invest in a body of believers (a church). What does this passage tell us about being committed to a body of believers and partnering with other believers? (Rhetorically, ask yourself: How effective is an army of just one person?) Read Hebrews 10:24-25; Romans 12:4-8; Psalm 133:1; Acts 4:32.

How does Paul's passion for the Gospel lead him to deeper affection for love for others, and especially for other believers? In your own words, why is Christian love for one-another so important? Read John 13:34, 1 John 3:11-16, Romans 12:10.

On Sunday, Jobey mentioned that where we spend our time, money, thoughts, and commitments is where, what, and who we are truly partnering with. What is most reflected when you think of your partnership in these areas?

Money: Commitment: Passion:

This passage shows us Paul pouring himself into the church at Philippi. Because Paul loves the Gospel foremost, he therefore takes great joy at seeing the church at Philippi advance the Gospel, and thus he loves the believers with whom he has partnered for that purpose. Take some time to reflect – how are you doing with loving other believers? Are you pouring yourself into the work of advancing the Gospel? Which ways are you doing this?

Are you partnering with others for the sake of Christ? Are your Christian friendships unique among all your friendships because of your common faith? Do you let hardships, busy schedules, or pride get in the way of deepening your Christian relationships? If so, what do you need to do differently? \_
