UNCONDITIONAL LOVE

Philippians 1.9 // 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 // 1 John 4 // Ephesians 2:4-5

Actually, the word for love that Paul uses here is the word agapē, which is...

- From God.
- Best modeled at the cross of Christ!
- Unconditional love.
- It serves regardless of circumstances.

Agape love is not sappy, it's sacrificial.

HEAD AND HEART

Philippians 1.10 // Romans 12:2

How does love abound though? How does it grow???

- Knowledge and Discernment
 - The word for knowledge here means "knowledge gained from personal experience."
 - The word for discernment here means "the ability to apply that knowledge gained in personal experience to the practical details of living."

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, is there anyone who is able to recite the memory verse?

Read through Philippians 1:9-11. What impacted you the most in these verses or in the message on Sunday?

In Exodus 28:6-12, it describes how the priest wore the ephod, a skillfully woven and intricate priestly garment, over his heart as a constant reminder to bear the names of the 12 tribes before the Lord. Likewise, Paul, while in chains, lovingly carries the names of the Philippians in his heart. Do you carry a similar burden and intercede in prayer for your brothers and sisters in Christ? If not, how can you cultivate this desire?

Read Colossians 1:9-11. How can this passage affect the way you pray for others?

Praying and interceding for others before God's throne of grace is one of the Christian's most profound conduits of joy and fellowship. How have you experienced the joy and blessing of praying on behalf of others? What are some obstacles that prevent you from praying for and with others?

In the context of abounding in our love for God, Pastor Eric talked about the vital role of both knowledge and discernment (Philippians 1:9-11) and the importance of the heart working in harmony with the mind. Why is it important to have both knowledge and discernment? What's the difference between knowing of God and knowing about Him?

Read through John Stott's quotation in the notes. Do you tend to focus more on truth over love or vice versa? If so, why? Why is it so imperative that truth and love go hand in hand?

Read 1 John 4:7-11. Knowing that God is love and that Christ's death perfectly exemplifies this agape love, how can we depend upon the Lord to abound in this love?

Take some time to pray that God would give you discernment and pray that in light of His love and Christ's perfect example of love that you would not only do what is right but that you also would do what is best.
