#### THE MESSINESS OF SANCTIFICATION

Jonah 3.10-4.4

Oftentimes, change will occur in our life; we'll see some movement forward, be encouraged, and then it seems like we take a major step backwards. On the surface, it seems to undo whatever good had occurred. But this is a legalistic way of seeing our lives. Change happens in odd stages and times. Real change happens, but real sin remains. As people of faith, we have to keep our eyes on the fruit that is growing that gives us hope of things to come.

# Jonah is a walking contradiction. This should be an odd comfort, but also a sobering wake up call.

His prayer shows the marks of what we might call spiritual infantile regression. Just as in natural life, the approach of a crisis, or the weight of a burden seems to force some people back into childish and inappropriate forms of behavior for mature adults, the same can happen in the spiritual realm. - Sinclair Ferguson

#### AN OVER-REALIZED, SELF-RIGHTEOUS SENSE OF JUSTICE

Jonah begins to explain himself to God. The fact that he does this shows that there is still something that he is not really repented of. There is still more to uncover. Sometimes, we really do grow, but when faced with certain circumstances, sin still has a way of floating to the top.

### THE PRODIGAL GOD

Jonah was so resentful towards God's grace that he wanted to give up, but God would not give up on him. "Prodigal" means "wasteful." And God shows His incredible love towards us by being "prodigal" in His giving of mercy and grace.

If God did not love us how He does,
He'd let us run and hide with no discomfort.
But He makes our running and hiding uncomfortable and awkward.
Because He loves us.
