LUST, DIVORCE, AND REMARRIAGE

Matthew Chapter 5.27-37, 19.1-12

LUST AND DIVORCE AS ADULTERY

Matthew 5.27-37, 19.1-12 // Malachi 2.16 // 1 Corinthians 7.10-16 Romans 13.14 // Colossians 1.22 // Ephesians 5.3 1 Thessalonians 5.22 // 2 Timothy 2.22 // Deuteronomy 24.1-4

Here, Jesus gives us another one of His six "antitheses" in His Sermon on the Mount. He clarifies the depth of what adultery really is. Marriage is one of the deep mysteries of God and the most incredible gift that He has given us, a picture of the Gospel and the Trinity.

What to do if you or someone you know is considering divorce.

- Seek biblical counsel from the Word itself, your pastor, and godly leaders and mentors. Don't go off what you feel or even simply what you want.
- Know that divorce is not the "easy" way out. The scars and damage can last years, especially with children involved.
- Every decision we make must be done "in faith" before the Lord with a clear conscience (Romans 14.23). Examine your heart deeply.

What to do if you have gotten a biblical divorce.

- You are free from the guilt and shame of the divorce. Believe that Christ has expiated the stain of any sin done by or to you.
- You should seek serious counsel and biblical insight on whether you are free to remarry. If you come to the conclusion that you are free to, you are free to remarry someone who has either never been married or is no longer married for a biblical reason (a widow/widower or potentially a biblical divorce, depending on your biblical conviction).
- If you are the one who offended, however, and your ex-spouse does not want to remarry or is remarried, you should not seek to remarry.

What to do if you have gotten an unbiblical divorce.

- If you are unmarried, you should not seek to remarry, unless it is to your ex-spouse.
- If you are already remarried, you should be humble, repentant, and thank God for his forgiveness and grace, stay married and pursue Christ with all you have. Apologies may be in order, and any kind of peacemaking should be attempted (though you can't control that outcome).

What to do if you have gotten an unbiblical divorce when you were an unbeliever.

- If you have not remarried and reconciliation is an option, seek that, unless the person is not a believer or if that person has already remarried.
- If that person does not want reconciliation, you should seek serious counsel and biblical insight on whether you are free to remarry.

What to do if you have never been married.

- Stay sexually pure in mind and deed.
- Go very slow pursuing someone. Get wise counsel. Don't consider marrying a nonbeliever or someone who has had an unbiblical divorce.

THE GOOD NEWS

Jesus came to bear our brokenness, shame, and guilt. He justifies and removes the stain of any and all sin done by or to us. In Him, we are righteous and pure, and we can stand blameless before God our Father when our hope and trust is in Christ.

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Matthew 5:27-37 . What was impactful from the sermon on Sunday or stuck out in these verses?
On Sunday, Jobey talked about Lust and Divorce. How do they relate? What do they have in common?
Malachi 2:16 says that God hates divorce. Read Matthew 19:1-12. Why does God hate it so much?
Read Exodus 20:14 and then re-read Matthew 5:27-28. Is Jesus adding to the Old Testament law?
Read Romans 13:14 . Some may say that Jesus is being too harsh here. What does Romans 13:14 say?
Read Genesis 39:8-13 and 2 Timothy 2:22 . What does Joseph do when he's tempted sexually? What are these two verses telling us to do when we get tempted sexually?
Read Ephesians 4:22-24 . After someone runs away from lust what you they do? Who is the old self and what are we commanded to do?
Read 2 Corinthians 10:5, Philippians 4:8, 9, and Matthew 15:19. What's another way we can battle lust?
Read Proverbs 27.17 and Galatians 6.1,2 . Are we called to keep our sins (including sexual sins and lust) a secret or share them with a trusted believer? Explain how confessing sin to one another would be beneficial to helping you battle lust?
As a group, break up into guys and girls with the goal of confessing sin, encouraging one another and reminding each other of the Good News. Here are some questions to ask:
