PRAYING FOR THE KINGDOM TO COME

Matthew Chapter 6.5-13

PRAYERS AS A MIRROR

Matthew 6.5-13

Our prayers reflect how much we are really depending on God. We don't pray for things that we use our own strength for. So how do we step out more in faith? Firstly, you must know the will of God.

The prayer that Jesus models begins with an important precursor to frame our prayers: that His Name would be seen as holy, His Kingdom would come, and His will would be done. All of the following requests for forgiveness and provision are requested *in light* of our ultimate aim of the Kingdom of the Gospel to come.

ADOPTED AND CHOSEN TO MAKE HIS NAME GREAT

God has chosen us, His people, for His glory, and He has adopted us as His children even though we were once not His people. He covenanted with His Son to purchase a people to be His, and He chose us for the work of making His Name holy, His Kingdom to come, and His will to be done on earth as it is in Heaven. He saved you to send you, not because He needed you, but because He LOVES you, and **Ephesians 1.4-6** tells us "He chose us according to the purpose of His will, to the praise of His glorious grace."

Ephesians 1.4-6

GOD'S WILL: THAT HIS KINGDOM COME

Revelation 7.9-17 // Matthew 24.14, 28.18-20 // John 17.17, 18

This is a monumental task that we cannot accomplish apart from Christ! And we see in **Revelation 5.8 and 8.3, 4** that our prayers are being collected, one by one, and are going up to God as a pleasant aroma when we pray *and obey* the Great Commission.

Questions to Consider...

- What are you currently doing that only God could accomplish?
- If you could do one thing for the sake of the Gospel, and you knew you wouldn't fail, and time, treasure, and talent were not an issue, what would it be?

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read **Matthew 6:5-15**. What stuck out to you the most in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

How would you describe your prayer life? _____

If it's weak, why do you think it is? If it's strong, how did you get to that point?

How does simply starting with recounting the truths and promises of God change the way you go to God in prayer? When we begin our prayers with, "God, I want Your Name to be made holy through my life, Your Kingdom to come, and Your will to be done on this earth as it is in Heaven *through Your power working in me,"* how does it change what you ask for? Or how you repent?

When you consider that you were sovereignly born and are living in a "reached" people group (21st Century America), and that there are 6,000 people groups (out of 11,000) that are unreached, how does this opening of the Lord's Prayer change your perspective on God's heart for your prayer life and the purpose of your life?

Read Revelation 5.9, 7.9-17, Matthew 24.14, 28.18, Genesis 22.17, 18 and John 17.17, 18. What do you see is God's clear "end game" and plan?

From these same verses, what is God's means by which He plans to accomplish this plan?

In what ways are you currently involved in God's desire and will to make His Name holy, His Kingdom come, and His will to be done on earth as it is in Heaven?

What ways might you consider adding or changing in your life? Structuring your calendar different, planning to go on a short-term missions trip, structuring your finances differently, opening up your home to host or lead a Community Group, visiting shelters or prisons with the Gospel?

Remember Jesus' words from last week, "where your treasure is, your heart will be also." Though specifically talking about money, where we place our time (a valuable commodity in our high paced society) and our talents is also indicative of where our hearts are. When we commit our time, treasure, and talents, to the making of God's Name holy, His Kingdom coming, and His will being accomplished, our hearts are found among the will of God.
