Philippians 1.12-18

PAUL'S REFLECTION ON HIS IMPRISONMENT

Philippians 1.12-18

Paul was imprisoned in either Caesarea or Rome after being arrested in Jerusalem (**Acts 22-25**). His enemies had even plotted to assassinate him, but ultimately he would spend two years in prison during this stint. During this time, some people were preaching in a way to somehow upset Paul, but this would not deter his focus.

Instead of focusing on personal loss, Paul is focused on Gospel gains.

HOW DID PAUL NOT RESPOND?

What should stick out to us the most is that there is not even a hint of self-pity in Paul's words. Often, we complain about our situation. Paul no doubt would love to have gone to Spain or elsewhere to boldly spread the Gospel, but instead of moping or complaining, he focused on where *God had put him*.

Again, we hear Paul's confidence from verse 1.6; he knows and believes that God is indeed control and has a plan to work out all things for good.

HOW CAN WE RESPOND LIKE PAUL?

Our response to suffering glorifies Jesus because it encourages others when we look upon Him to be our strength. *Especially* when we are treated wrongly, our focus and response gives others strength.

1 Corinthians 7.17-28

Rather, when we make our focus and aim something else, particularly different circumstances, we rob ourselves of joy, others of strength, and God of glory.

To often, we are convinced that "if I only..."

- Was married
- Had a godly husband or wife
- Had more money
- Hard more time
- Had an important ministry
- Had more talent...then we could really glorify God!

Rather, we need to be content with where God has us, focusing on what we can do and how He is working on us in those places.

2 Timothy 2.8-10

You may be bound in your circumstances, but the Gospel is not bound in your circumstances.

Before your group starts, is there anyone who is able to recite the memory verse?

Read Philippians 1:12-18. What impacted you the most from this scripture or from Sunday's message?

What has happened to Paul, and how is it advancing the Gospel?

When Paul uses the term "advance the gospel", He is showing the need to push God's kingdom forward rather than dwelling on past or present problems. As believers how do you handle past or present problems? Where do you turn? Are your eyes fixed on the problem, or God's promise that He has a plan to work out all things for good?

Share a time when God has used a trial in your life to advance the Gospel.

Read **James 1:2-4**. What does the testing of your faith produce?

Read 1 Corinthians 7:17-28. Are you content with your situation or circumstance? Are you content with your job? Your living situation? Your financial situation? How do we bring glory to God if we aren't? How should we respond? Read Philippians 2:14-15 and 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18.

Take some time to pray and confess. If you aren't content in your situation, pray for your heart to be fixed on God's glory and to be so thankful for His saving grace that your circumstances pale in comparison.
