Philippians 2:1

Paul reminds the church of four JOY-FILLED blessings of being in a unified Christian community....

- Encouragement
 - Are you encouraged by being "In Christ?"
- Comfort from His love
 - Have you ever received comfort from His unconditional agape love?
- Participation in the Spirit
 - o Participation is a Fellowship, a Koinonia; it's Communion with the Holy Spirit.
 - Have you been blessed by being in a Church community?
- Affection and Sympathy (Tenderness and compassion)
 - After confessing sin, have you been shown compassion, or grace beyond what you deserve from someone here?

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before your group starts, ask if anyone is able to recite the memory verse.

Read **Philippians 1:27** and **2:1-4**. What stood out to you the most in these passages or from the sermon on Sunday?

In these passages, Paul tells us to be of the same mind, of one mind, and in full accord. Explain in your own words what you think he means? Read 1 Corinthians. 1:10, Colossians 3:13-14 and Galatians 3:28.

Before moving to the next question, discuss with your Community Group how you can be more unified as a group._____

Most would agree it's okay within the church to have individual preferences when it comes to dress, music, sports teams, and food. But what about more serious or divisive issues? Work? Politics? Theology? Work-life balance? Language? What are some gray areas that have real potential to cause division within churches or which *have* caused divisions in churches you have been a part of? What should our response be? Read **1 Peter 3:8**, Psalm 133:1, Romans 12:1.


How do we go about becoming more unified as a church? Can we simply work hard to get along? Who joins us together in unity? Read **1 Peter 3:8**, **Ephesians 4:16**, **Romans 6:5**, and **John 17:23**.

How have you been pursuing unity in the Church through Christ? Are you actively seeking to not just avoid disputes, but to join in unity with other believers for the advancement of the gospel through the church?

Using the P.R.A.Y. model, spend time preaching the gospel to yourself, and asking the Lord to reveal practices, feelings, attitudes, or actions that may be interfering in you fully enjoying God's gift of unity within the church. Ask for a heart that desires unity within the church so the gospel can be advanced.
