HOW TO PRAY

James 5.16 // Matthew 6.5-13, 7.7-11

- Preach the Gospel to Yourself: Bring to mind the promises of God and Gospel truths
 that will remind you of God's ultimate plan and purpose. vs. 9, 10
- Repent: Acknowledge where you've been doubting or believing lies and being in sin; remember His forgiveness and your adoption as you run to Him. vs. 12
- **Ask:** Ask God for new perspective and for the things you need. You'll notice after doing the above two, your requests will be different than before. **vs. 11**
- Yield with Thanksgiving: Surrender to God's will and ways, that you would not do your will as you are tempted to, but to do His. vs. 13 (and back to 9, 10)

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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read Matthew 6.5-13, 7.7-11. What stuck out to you the most in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?
Last week, in our Community Groups we talked about prayer. How has your prayer life been since our last meeting? Has it changed? Why or why not?
When it comes to the main four elements of the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6.5-15 , Praise/Preaching the Gospel to Yourself, Repentance, Asking, and Yielding with Thanks), which do you normally start your prayers with? Does it depend on what you are praying for?
The answer is obvious, but when we feel the distance, guilt, and shame of our sin that keeps us from prayer and keeps us from being with Him, we need to ask ourselves, "do I really believe God is glorified by shaming me even after I've been forgiven and cleansed?" God would not be glorified by that; if He did that, He should be despised as a treacherous and unjust God who forgives, but then still punishes. Read Matthew 11.28-30. What does Jesus invite us to do with anything that weighs us down, including the guilt and shame of our sin?
To continue to carry guilt is to say, "I don't believe the Gospel; I don't believe that Jesus really forgave me and that I can really lay down my burden and find rest in Christ. I need to be punished, because Jesus' punishment wasn't enough." Considering this, what solution, then, is there for when we are heavy laden with guilt and shame over our sin?
How does simply starting with recounting the truths and promises of God change the way you go to God in prayer? How does starting your prayers with the reminder of the Gospel change what you ask for? Or how you repent?
Do you have a plan or practice to memorize Scripture? Memorizing Scripture is one of the absolute best ways to deepen your prayer life, and especially to really beginning to pray for God's will, not yours. One app that is great is called Fighter Verses , and there are others as well. Storing God's Word in our heart and learning how to apply His promises in our prayers will keep you more readily walking with the Spirit in the freedom of your adoption.
Who in your life do you, or can you, regularly " Fight Club " with? Who can you even send a quick text or email to confess some sin or struggle and ask for prayer?
Is it possible to set up a regular meeting time with them in order to encourage and fight for each other in the Gospel? If so, do it soon and get in that habit! Start challenging your

friends and family to make God's Name holy and see His Kingdom come and will accomplished in all nations through each other's' lives. Pray for a heart for the nations, that

God would save people from every tongue, tribe, and nation, since that is exactly what He

desires, and pray that He would lead you to ways that you can be a part of the Great

Commission. If your prayer life is suffering, start with small prayers through the day. Quick "thank You, Lord, for adopting me" type prayers. Simply, short, Gospel prayers. Then, add in

short, simple prayers for family and friends. Try to get in a habit of having quick

conversations with your Abba, your Dad, throughout the day.
