# COMPLAINING: THE THIEF OF JOY

Philippians 2.14-18

### THE COMPLAINING HEART REVEALS

Complaining kills contentment, it robs us of whatever joy could be had, and robs God from being glorified in your life.

Numbers 11.1-23

The story of the Israelites in the wilderness gives us great insight into what our complaining reveals about ourselves. Complaining shows us that we have a distorted view of 5 things:

- 1). Distorted view of the past
- 2). Distorted view of the present
- 3). Distorted view of ourselves
- 4). Distorted view of God
- 5). Distorted view of the future

### THREE REASONS TO FIGHT COMPLAINING

Philippians 2.14-18

Paul gives us three primary reasons why we should not complain:

1). It is an attack on God. Complaining reveals that we are unsatisfied with the cards that God has dealt us. We want more and believe we deserve more. We are expressing that we are not happy with His plan.

# We should be a proclaiming people, not a complaining people.

- 2). It ruins our witness to the lost. Complaining causes us to blend in with the rest of the world. Paul pits complaining directly in opposition with being a light. When we don't complain, we are being blameless and innocent, acting as children of God, being a light in a crooked world, proclaiming the Good News, and being a blessing to the church and the pastors in your life.
- **3).** It burdens the church. What makes a pastor glad? When his people are rejoicing with and are glad with him. Paul here says that when the people are living fruitful lives, it makes him proud to have been called to lead them. We should aim to be a blessing to those who lead us and care for us.

## LIVING AS SHINING LIGHTS

At the end of the day, Paul is calling Christians to be different; to be distinct among a twisted world. But complaining is a roadblock to true humility, and causes us to shine lights on our own kingdoms, rather than God's. The solution for us is to hold on to the Word of life, to be living sacrifices for the One who has

# COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before group starts, is there anyone who can recite the week's memory verse?

Read Philippians 2:14-18. What did God show you through His Word and through the sermon on Sunday?

What do you find yourself complaining about the most?

Read Luke 6.43-45 and Mark 7.20-23. How does Jesus describe our words (and therefore our complaining), and what does He say they are indicative of?

Think about what you particularly complain about. What do you think your complaining reveals about what is in your heart?

Without cheating and looking at the sermon notes, can you remember the three reasons why Paul says not to complain, and the damage complaining does to each of those reasons?

Read Romans 8:5-8. When we complain, we are setting our minds on our flesh rather than the Spirit. A mind that is set on the flesh is a direct assault on God and brings nothing but death. How can we fight this fleshly mindset?

Read Ephesians 4.17-22. Here Paul tells the Ephesians what to "put off," and what to "put on." When you catch yourself complaining, what does Paul here tell you that you can you "put on" and remind yourself of so that you can "put off" the ways of the Gentiles, and rather, walk as light?

Spend time as a group confessing the things you often complain about, but even more importantly, where you think those complaints are coming from (discontentment, selfishness, pride, greed, etc.). Pray for each other, and pray for each other to be able to "put on" the mind of Christ.
