HOPE THAT DOESN'T DISAPPOINT

Colossians 1.3-5 // 1 Thessalonians 5.8 // Romans 5.5

Hope is only as sure as what you are hoping in. If you "hope" your favorite team wins the championship, you're success is subject to odds, talent, and strategy. But our hope is in something sure and definite when we place our hope in the Gospel of our salvation, our heavenly hope.

Psalm 20.6, 33.17, 18, 71.5, 78.7, 119.81, 114

If you are longing for heaven on earth *in this life* you will be left empty, sorely disappointed and deeply dissatisfied.

THE GOSPEL IS ALIVE

Colossians 1.5-8 // Psalm 19.7 // Hebrews 4.12, 13 // 1 Peter 1.23-25 1 John 2.14 // 1 Corinthians 1.18, 3.5-9 // 1 Thessalonians 2.13

The Gospel is no mere "thing" or "tool." It is a sword, but it is "sharper" than any sword, and it is a living and sovereign sword, at work in our hearts, bearing fruit and growing, even if we can't see it now. 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COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

What stuck out to you the most or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?
What are some things you have hoped for, or hope for now, and how did it turn out or do you think it will turn out?
How do some of these hopes we have differ from having a hope placed on the Gospel, and how should that affect how we live?
When we have a high confidence in what we are hoping for, we have excitement and anticipation. When there is less confidence, there is a more sullen cynicism. Read Romans 5.5, Psalm 20.7, 8, 33.17, 18. What do these verses say about the hope we can place on God?
Read Colossians 3.3-6. What does Paul say happens to us when this hope of the Gospel is heard and understood by us?
Often, we don't see fruit that is growing. But we live "by faith, not by sight." Read Psalm 19.7, Hebrews 4.12, 13, 1 Peter 1.23-25, 1 Thessalonians 2.13. How would you describe how the Gospel goes to work in us?
Knowledge alone does not make you godly. This is exactly what Paul was potentially combating against the false teaching of the Gnostics. What is the Holy Spirit's purpose as He aims to "guide you into all truth" (John 16.13)? Read Colossians 1.9, 10, Ephesians 1.16-18, John 5.37-40, 2 Peter 1.3, 4, 1 Timothy 1.5 for insight.
Colossians 1.9 specifically tells us that we should continually "be filled with the knowledge of His will." Why is it important for us to continually be filled with knowledge and promises of God? Don't we know enough to keep us going through the week and through our days?
It's very difficult to trust in, believe in, hope in, and grow in love for something or someone that you either don't understand or don't learn more about or spend time getting to know. Christ is unlimited in His depth and glory, and the more we know about Him, the more we love Him and want to be conformed to be like Him. Philip Ryken said that "the goal of theology is worship." Theology simply means "the study of God." To close, share with the group a particular theological truth about Christ that recently has caused you to trust and worship Him more deeply.
