### SO WHAT IS PAUL SAYING?

#### 2 Corinthians 13.5

In Colossians 1.23, Paul is describing what every true believer's life should look like. He has made a case that knowing Christ and being filled with the knowledge of His glory will result in a changed life, and here Paul, in part, describes what that life looks like. It's the long way of saying that Christ will "present you holy and blameless and above reproach before Him, *if indeed* you are a true believer, not a phony who will shift from the hope of the Gospel."

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### COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Read **Colossians 1.21-23**. What stuck out to you the most or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday or from these verses?\_\_\_\_\_

The question of whether we can lose our salvation or not is known as the doctrine of "eternal security" or "perseverance (or preservation) of the saints." Why do you think it's important for us to have a good, solid understanding of this doctrine?

**Colossians 1.23** is one verse that many find troubling. Before the group, read through all the verses in the sermon notes under the "Can We Lose Our Salvation" heading. Which of these seem the most powerfully clear, and how does the practice of using "clearer" texts to interpret "less clear" texts help you approach this verse in Colossians?

Paul here is ensuring the Colossian believers that Christ will indeed, by His own power, deliver them to the Father as blameless and perfect. His caveat, however, is that this will happen *only if* they are truly adopted sons and daughters. How does Paul imply to the Colossians how you can *tell* whether or not you are an adopted son or daughter?

Why wouldn't Paul just say, "if indeed you are true believers"? \_\_\_\_\_\_

Read **2** Corinthians 13.5. Why does Paul ask the Corinthians to examine themselves, and what do you think the "test" might be?

Read Jesus' words in **Matthew 7.17-23. 1 John 2.19, 20**, and **2 Timothy 3.1-9**. How do these passages show us that simply saying or believing that you are a Christian is not what it takes to ensure that you are a Christian?

Martin Luther famously said, "we are saved by grace alone, but the grace that saves is never alone." He is echoing James 2.14-20, 26. Our works will *prove* that we are saved; but remember these works are not just outward works of obedience, but most importantly inward works of repentance, heart change, worship, and love for God and people (fruit of the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5.19-26)). In what ways have you seen "evidence," even if small, that you are saved and that the Holy Spirit is truly at work within you?

In what ways can you cultivate more fruit so that you can be more and more assured that you are an adopted child of God? See Colossians 1.23 for a clue. Then read John 17.17, 2 Timothy 3.16, 17, Hebrews 4.12.
