IMITATING OTHERS

Philippians 3.17-21

WHO DO YOU IMITATE?

Though Paul warns of the comparison game, he also encourages believers to be imitators of those who have their eyes on Christ. Like it or not, you are imitating someone somehow. You've learned traits from your parents, or you've tried to keep up with the Joneses, or you've become a product of society.

We become what we behold.

Marriage: Our tendency is to want our *spouse* to imitate another godly spouse. But we don't look for examples of what *we* should be like. *Or*, we just want the blessings of a godly couple, without doing the things they do to get there.

Money: Do you just wish you were like people who had money? Or do you look to imitate certain people for what they *do* with their money?

Ministry: Do you pursue wisdom and guidance from others who are doing things you would like to do or get better at? Or do you just do it your way?

Attitude: Who around you consistently has a godly attitude? Have you ever asked them what they do to maintain an eternal perspective?

WHY DO WE IMITATE?

Imitation is in the midst of the essence of the incarnation, and incarnation is in the midst of the essence of discipleship.

- 1. We Need to Imitate Godly Examples: Firstly, we need people to imitate, because we need in-flesh examples of people following Christ. Don't believe me? We have a whole bible, God's written Word, that records human examples that aren't Christ for us to learn from.
- 2. Younger Believers Need It: new believers need others to incarnate the lifestyle, attitudes, and character of Christ.
- 3. Non-Believers Need It: For many, Christians will be the only "bible" they will ever read. We are the only image of God they may ever see.

THE ULTIMATE EXAMPLE

Ultimately, of course, Paul wants us to imitate Christ. He says, "follow me *as I* follow Christ" (1 Corinthians 11.1). When it comes to marriage, He is the faithful Bridegroom who looks past our flaws. With money, He left His heavenly home to live among enemies, where He then poured out His life unto death for the sake of others. In ministry, He came to bind the brokenhearted, minister to orphans and widows, and save the lost sheep, neglecting the accolades of man and prestige. With attitude, He, "for the joy set before Him endured the cross" (Hebrews 12.2).

Before group starts, is there anyone who can recite the week's memory verse?

Read Philippians 3:17-21. What impacted you the most from this Scripture or from Sunday's message?

On Sunday, Jobey gave examples of people we imitate. Is there one example in particular that stuck out to you, or are there other topics that you aim to imitate (good or bad), such as fashion, creativity, personality, skills, etc.

Read Philippians 2:5-8 and Hebrews 13:7. What or who are we to imitate? Why is it so difficult? In your own life, what are the temptations or lies that keep you from obeying these verses?


Read 1 Peter 1:16, Leviticus 11:44. According to these verses, what is the expectation? Can we alone as sinners do or accomplish this command? Read Romans 12:1-2. Once again we are called to an impossible task in and of ourselves, but God does not leave us on the path of destruction. He has provided a way, someone to follow, a life to imitate. How are we made holy?

When you were younger you may have heard your parents say or teachers say, "you are who your friends are." Read Philippians 4:6-9 and Colossians 3:1-17. Our time in the Word and the relationships that God has placed in our life are an opportunity to imitate our Savior to the world. Which of these characteristics or actions do you find challenging or need the Holy Spirit's help to imitate? Discuss with one another as you encourage each other in fruit that you see in their lives.

Christ is our ultimate example and has accomplished everything that we were and are incapable of fulfilling. He has given us rest in the shadow of His righteousness and the Holy Spirit continues to sanctify our hearts so that we can imitate the Savior to the lost and to our brothers and sisters. Spend some time in prayer praising the Lord for His work, repenting of our wrong imitations, asking the Holy Spirit to provide the strength we need, and trusting God that He will accomplish the work He has started.
