## PATIENCE DURING TROUBLING TIMES

James 5.7-13

#### THE PATIENCE OF A FARMER

James points to a farmer when exhorting the church to have patience. Farmers need perspective. They know what to expect, they have been down this road before, they have seen others farm, and they don't have a false expectation. All of this gives them patience. But he also tells us to "establish your hearts."

Establish: "gain a footing," having "firm support."

A firm understanding and perspective gives the farmer patience. A firm understanding and perspective gives the believer patience.

#### WHAT GIVES US UNDERSTANDING AND PERSPECTIVE?

Specifically, James says "establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand." It is this truth that establishes us.

- He has not left us as orphans (John 14.18)
- He is near the broken hearted (Psalm 34.18)
- He will never leave us nor forsake us (Hebrews 13.5)
- He will uphold us with His righteous right hand (Isaiah 41.10)
- Our Father is stronger than all, nothing can take us from Him (John 10.29)
- This life of suffering is a light and momentary affliction (2 Corinthians 4.17)

Psalm 119.9, 50 // Romans 8:32-39

#### THE EXAMPLE OF OTHERS

James 5.10-13

The prophets were known to have been persecuted not just by non-believers, but also by the Jews who did not want to hear their message of repentance. Notice how James then shifts from "patience" to "endurance" here.

Job's is no groveling, passive, unquestioning submission; Job struggled and questioned, and sometimes even defied, but the flame of faith was never extinguished in his heart.

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# **COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK**

Before your group starts, is there anyone who can share the Memory Verse?

Read James 5:7-13. What stuck out to you in these verses or was the most impactful from the message on Sunday?

We learned on Sunday that "suffering is inevitable" and it's not a question of if, but when. How do you deal with suffering when it occurs? Where or who do you turn to?

What are some ways in your own life that you have grown in patience? What was the process like?

Read Psalm 119:50, John 14:18, Psalm 34:18, Hebrews 13:5, Isaiah 41:10, John 10:29, and 2 Corinthians 4:17. How can promises like these bring comfort in times of affliction?


Read **Exodus 16:1-2**. Many times the Israelites grumbled against one another when they became impatient. Although the Lord was sustaining them and fulfilling his promises to them, they were quick to complain. Now look at **Exodus 16:8**. Who were they really grumbling against? Why is our complaining actually discontentment towards the Lord?

How can we look to the prophets as examples of suffering well? Look for examples in the Old Testament to share with your group.

Share with your group anyways you are currently suffering or going through affliction. Pray and encourage one another with God's precious promises revealed to you in this week's sermon.


